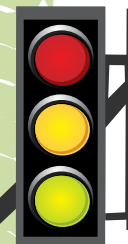

## MSA History

In the early 1960's the concepts of developing a professional organization began with superintendents meeting together to discuss possible solutions to mutual problems. Soon after, other public service agencies and vendor representatives recognized the benefits of this interaction and an association began. During the 1960's two founding chapters were formed, one in the San Francisco Bay area and one in the Los Angeles area. The name Maintenance Superintendents Association (MSA) was soon adopted.
