Frequently asked questions

What is the difference between the Foundation and the MSA?

The MSA and the “Foundation” are two separate organizations. They each have their own officers, by-laws, and bank accounts.

If the MSA is a non-profit organization, why develop the Foundation?

The MSA is designated as a 501 (c) (6) which only allows for businesses to deduct contributions as a business expense. The Foundation is designated as a 501 (c) (3) , which allows for tax deductible contributions and matching gifts for individuals.

Where does my donation go to?

You may designate, or “earmark” your donation to go to a specific MSA Scholarship fund, a specific MSA Chapter’s Scholarship program, or to the Beverley Copeland Endowment Fund.

What is the Beverley Copeland Endowment Fund?

An endowment Fund allows for the investment of our donations to mature with interest. The Endowment Fund was named after the Matriarch of the MSA— Beverley Copeland.

Can I transfer money from a trust fund?

Absolutely! Your trust advisor should have all of the information you need to make it a smooth transfer.



How will I know my donation will go to a specific scholarship?

There will be separate account balances for each scholarship fund and program. Earmarked donations will only be distributed for specific scholarships.

What proof will I have that I made a donation?

Upon receipt of your donation, you will be sent a letter from our Chairman, thanking you for the donation, with the amount, and our tax ID for your records.

Can I donate an item such as a car, boat, or golf clubs for a scholarship raffle?

Yes, you may. All we ask of you is to provide us the specific details of the item (brand name, model, other specifics), and what you believe to be the value of the donation. Your receipt letter will state all of this information.
